2026 and beyond? And how will the University of Arizona and our entire enterprise – Agriculture, Life and Veterinary Sciences, and Cooperative Extension – continue to



Membership in the Cardon Academy is more than honorific – it carries the expectation of active service in Academy programs and workshops. Since being formed in 2010, the Cardon


