The primary responsibilities of Professors of Practice within University of Arizona College of Agriculture, Life and Environmental Sciences are in the broad area of instruction, including the teaching of undergraduate and/or graduate courses, advising, assessment, teacher training, mentoring, funding acquisition, and service as appropriate to the promotion of the scholarship of teaching and the educational mission of the academic unit.

Professor of Practice faculty shall have all the rights, obligations, and duties of other non-tenure track faculty members, except as specifically limited by either ABOR policy or the University Handbook for Appointed Personnel.
