Extension integrates teaching, issue-driven research, and creative activity for engaged outreach that ultimately leads to a change in behaviors or conditions. They perform a vital role in the three primary functions of a land-grant university: teaching, research, and Extension. Criteria are listed below for initial appointment, then promotion for each Extension Specialist rank.
